

## Consensus – Action planning

### Working out the details

To make planning very interactive and inclusive so that all young people and adults participate, use a sticky wall, recycled paper, and markers. Write concrete ideas on paper, one idea per paper, and use the sticky wall to organize them.

<p>Think about all the things we need to do – concrete actions.</p> <p>List one action step on one sheet of paper.</p> <p>Examples:            -Research facts about soda.            -Develop student survey about soda use            -Contact dance studios looking for volunteer instructor</p>	<p>Post action steps on sticky wall. Take out duplications.</p> <p>Organize them by commonalities – group them.</p> <p>Give the cluster/group a name – identify the theme.</p>	<p>Review groups or clusters. Form work teams for each group.</p> <p>Identify volunteers for each group – write names next to cluster.</p>	<p>Each team will think about a start up event and additional action steps.</p> <p>Think about the timeline and organize action steps in a time sequence.</p> <p>What needs to be done first, next, etc?</p>	<p>The teams will bring their time lines together and create one full time table. Review and modify.</p> <p>Where do you need to coordinate with other teams?</p> <p>Discuss how you make decisions?</p> <p>Communication between teams?</p>	<p>Review process – celebrate everybody’s involvement.</p> <p>Affirm commitment by creating a catchy slogan or visual.</p> <p>GET STARTED</p>
