Project Summary:

The Personal Responsibility Education Program (PREP) supports comprehensive programming to foster the prevention of adolescent pregnancy, sexually transmitted infections (STIs) and Human Immunodeficiency Virus (HIV). PREP funding will support community-based programs that utilize a youth development framework and implement evidence-based or best practice strategies to promote adolescent health and reduce risk for youth (ages 10-20) living in communities that lack social and economic opportunities to enable teens to develop to their full potential. This would include youth from racial and ethnic minorities, all youth from socioeconomically disadvantaged communities, and/or otherwise have special circumstances such as youth living in foster care, homeless youth, youth involved in the juvenile justice system, and others.

PREP programs will develop and implement specific activities based on the needs and resources of the communities and the developmental, socio-economic, racial, ethnic and cultural needs and perspectives of the population(s) to be served. Topics, messages and teaching methods must be suitable to specific age groups of youth, based upon varying capacities of cognitive, emotional and behavioral development.

PREP programs will implement evidence-based program (EBP) models that include three adult preparation topics and have been evaluated and shown to change behavior such as delaying the onset of sexual activity, increasing condom or contraceptive use for sexually active youth, and/or reducing pregnancy among youth; and activities to ensure access for youth to comprehensive reproductive health care and family planning services.
