Defining Consent

compliance in or approval of what is done or proposed by another

Defining Choice

an act of selecting or making a decision when faced with two or more possibilities

Tips for Getting Consent

Communication

Open and honest communication is crucial. Talk openly about desire, boundaries, and comfort levels.

Mutuality

Consent should be a mutual agreement between parties. Consent can be withdrawn at any time.

Enthusiastic Agreement

Agreements should be clear and enthusiastic, and they should be obtained at each new levels of activity/intimacy

Healthy Practices for Discussing Consent

Educate and build awareness

Define consent clearly - what does it include and exclude Communicate, reflect on, and discuss boundaries Highlight non-verbal cues

Establish a culture of consent

Encourage the use of positive and affirmative language
Illustrate consent as ongoing
Leverage peer education like peer-facilitated discussions

Include role-playing and scenarios

Use interactive exercises to practice asking and giving consent Address challenges participants have Empower bystanders
